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1. STUDY THE WORD

Read Luke 6:37-42. Jesus's teaching in this section uses lots of proverbs, parables and word pictures, which sometimes makes it difficult to understand. Why do you think Jesus chose to speak/teach this way? Why might these teachings/sayings be harder for us to understand than the original audience? How does the previous section of scripture help us better understand Jesus's teaching in this section?
