

Verses 5-8 speak to being satisfied in the abundance of God's provision. What does it mean to be satisfied? What often leads us to dissatisfaction with things in this life? What leads us to dissatisfaction with God? What does the psalmist do in these verses to help himself rest in the satisfaction of God's abundant provision? How can you do these same things in your life?

Verses 9-11 proclaim a confidence in God's power and perfect plan. How can the psalmist be so sure that God will rescue him from his enemies and problems? How can we be assured that God will help us and rescue us from sins and struggles? What is a current sin or problem in your life that you need God's power to rescue you from? What can you do to secure a confident expectation that He will rescue you?

3. APPLY THE TRUTH

There is a strong vein of delighting in God throughout this psalm. Praising, Lifting Hands, Singing, Exulting. How can you delight in God more this week as you seek to love and trust Him more?

1. CONNECT TO THE TEXT

2. ASSESS YOUR LIFE

In verses 1-4 the Psalmist goes to great length to paint a picture of his longing for God's presence. On a scale of 1-10 how much do you long for God's presence on a daily basis? Are there signs of complacency in your pursuit of Jesus? If so, what is leading to this complacency or lack of longing for Jesus? What steps can you take to grow deeper in your longing for God's presence?
